Ruth Shan Class Re-Opens Oct. 22

The Ruth Shan international affairs class will re-open Tuesday morning, Oct. 22, at the Community House, beginning at 10 o'clock.

This class is sponsored by the AAUW and the Woman's Club but is not an invitational group. Any woman who is interested in a continuous program running through to May, 1947, and consisting of reports, talks and discussion on international subjects, is urged to attend.

There is no fee attached to membership, except those necessary for materials. The class is one and one-half hours in duration, and is held each Tuesday morning.

When the class was formed in 1920 as a committee of the newly organized Birmingham branch of the AAUW, there was only one other woman's organization in existence here at the time. This was the Birmingham Woman's Club.

There is no specific age group which attends the class, but instead there are certain grandmothers who bring their granddaughters with them.
