AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM

Proposition No. 1.
SHALL Section 2 of Chapter II of the Charter of the City of Birmingham be amended by the addition thereto of a new subsection to be known as subsection (4), the same to read as follows:
(4) For the acquiring, establishment, operation, extension and maintenance of facilities for the storage and parking of vehicles within the corporate limits of the City of Birmingham, including the fixing and collection of charges for services and use thereof on a public utility basis, and for such purpose to acquire by gift, purchase, condemnation or otherwise the land necessary therefor.

Proposition No. 2.
SHALL Sections 4 and 8 of Chapter IV of the Charter of the City of Birmingham be amended to read as follows:
Section 4. No person shall be deemed to be nominated as a candidate for any elective office, whether or not the person thereby placed in nomination. Any person desiring to become a candidate for any elective office shall, on or before the fifth Saturday prior to such election, file with the city clerk a certificate of nomination in substantially the following form:

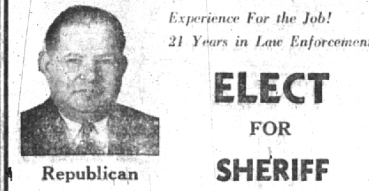
