**Sigsler Air Tour An Epic**

Kim Sigler's campaign tour of the Upper Peninsula by air was an epochal flight. While its principal purpose was vote getting, the Republican gubernatorial candidate had a double purpose in making it. He wanted to prove his often made assertion that a closer association of the Upper and Lower Peninsulas was possible by utilizing the airplane.

The flight started on Friday, Oct. 11, and ended in the same city on the following Sunday.

In that short period of time, Calumet, Houghton, Hancock, Marquette, Ingon Mountain, Norway, Hermansville, Menominee and Escanaba were visited. Four major political speeches were made and approximately 20,000 people of that remote area of the state had an opportunity to see the candidate and hear him. Other thousands heard him over the radio.

Some older politicians were apprehensive when a group of Detroit Sigler followers offered him the use of a chartered PCA airplane for the trip.

"It will cost too much and look bad," they said.

**Costs Less Than By Auto**

Newspapermen in the party got busy with pencil and paper checking costs. Their figures revealed that the cost of the trip was slightly more than \$100 per person. They also figured that on the basis of newspaper expense accounts the same trip by automobile or train would have cost more than \$200 each.

On the credit side and aside from its political value, the trip had a far-reaching importance. It proved the feasibility of landing large airships in small airports. Three of the stops were made on flying fields that would hardly come up to the minimum requirements of the government.

The hazards of such a trip were fully explained to Mr. Sigler before the takeoff. His reaction was typical.

"I have told the people throughout the Upper and Lower Peninsulas," he explained, "This can be done by making use of the airplane."

"Some folks have said that our trip was a bit of air pioneering. If such is the case I am glad."

**Make Michigan Air-Minded**

Many people of the communities we visited had never seen so large an airplane. If this trip has stimulated interest in flying, and if it results in the building of bigger and better airports in the Upper Peninsula, it is important.

"If elected, governor, I intend to make Michigan the most air-minded state in the union."

The Pennsylvania Central Airline was fully aware of the importance of the tour and assigned Capt. Norman McNeil, chief test pilot, Capt. John McDonald, and Miss Faye Smith, senior stewardess, as the crew.

Members of the Republican state ticket who accompanied Mr. Sigler were Frederick M. Alger, Jr., candidate for Secretary of State, and Muri K. Aten, Auditor General candidate. Present also were four Detroit newspapermen, two police officers assigned to guard the gubernatorial candidate, and George J. Averitt, of Birmingham, Sigler's close associate and campaign manager.
