Pierce PTA Group Will Seek To Raise Funds To Provide More Visual Aid Equipment

The general program for the coming year at Pierce school will focus on a study of audio-visual methods of education with the possibility that some such equipment, supplementary to the secondary by the Board of Education, can be purchased by the school, it was made known at the Pierce PTA meeting held last Thursday.

The money raising project will take the form of a fair to be held Nov. 22. It was hoped that this project will raise a sum of money large enough to purchase badly needed pieces of equipment for the students equipment which cannot otherwise be obtained, as well as providing for next year's PTA budget.

"I'll be glad to help, if it's going to benefit my little girl," said Mrs. J. F. Hanna of Bannville road when the project was announced. Her remark is reported as typical of the general reactions of the large group present. Many parents volunteered their services, including Mrs. August Jafano, Mrs. Fred McCullough, Mrs. M. E. Westerly, Mrs. Lester Stinson, Mrs. Sam Stinson and Mrs. Jack May.

State Convention Reviewed
Earlier, the room mothers had accepted responsibility for supervision of booths at the fair, at which many fathers also will serve.

President Wilbur Sears, who presided at this first meeting, reviewed the state convention at the Soe. He pointed out that "It Is Now Our Task," the theme of the convention, can be applied locally.

"As one of the educators who addressed us stated," said Mr. Sears "the national PTA is one of the greatest forces for good in the world today. We can be an effective, if small, part of it here at Pierce if we do our part. It must be our aim to give each child equal privileges. Convention speakers emphasized the importance of learning to live together, of learning to love all children, not only our own."

"They said we must learn to develop in our children a consciousness of world citizenship."

Open House Planned
In addition to the fair, "Open House" at Pierce—when parents visit school rooms and teachers—will be held Thursday evening, Oct. 24.

At this time Gerald White, principal, will speak on audio-visual training with demonstrations of material now at hand. Superintendent Dwight B. Ireland will talk on a matter of importance to Pierce parents.

Other programs for the future following the fair date, Nov. 22, will include a December Christmas musical program and a January meeting under the auspices of the PTA Council. February and March will be devoted to the audio-visual training subject.

Dr. Ernst Scheyer, professor of Art History and Humanities at Wayne University, has begun his 16-week illustrated lecture series at the Baldwin Library.

Wednesday morning from 10 o'clock to 11 o'clock and the subject "The People and the Art of the Bible." Dr. Scheyer, who lives on Ravine road, holds the position of professor of art history in the University of Cologne. Lectures 1 and 2 of the first section of the course, "Mesopotamia," will be on "Ur of the Chaldees" and the "City of Abraham," while lectures 3 and 4 are "The Tower of Babel." The second part of the course, "Old Egypt," will have as titles for lectures 5 and 6, "The World of Joseph" and 7 and 8, "The World of Moses."

Solomon's Temple
Section three of the series, "Palestine of the Kings" will have lectures 9 and 10 on "The Temple of Solomon," while 11 and 12 are on "Jerusalem and the Romans." The last lectures of the fourth section of the course, "Palestine of Jesus and Paul," will have as the topic for the numbers 13 and 14 talks, "The Hellenistic Venice." The final discussion, entitled "The Beginnings of Christian Church Building, Sculpture and Painting."
