MAYBE you have a baby. Even so, if you are expecting again, or if you are to be a brand new mother, this season brings good news. That is, complete maternity wardrobes are back.

Instead of relying upon the same little black dress for every occasion, the mother-to-be can now really dress up for dinner and evenings. She can keep her secret for a long time, too, in such attractive and yet concealing fashions as the two-piece dress pictured above—a young looking mandarin jacket flaring over a cleverly styled skirt adjusted at the waist with snaps.

were the lowest since 1926. While we will probably import more fats and oils from the Philippines and the East Indies, the increase will not be large. The United States has severely cut land and oil shipments overseas due to the acute situation here at home.

So the American housewife is going to be required to learn to make that old fashioned "boiled dressing"—which really isn't boiled. It's just cooked in a double boiler and made from milk, eggs, flour, seasonings and a little butter or other fat.

Another substitute dressing is made by combining a little lemon juice, a bit of sugar and sprinkling of salt. It is fine for a topping or salads—either fruit or vegetable.

Many women have learned to relieve the shortage by rendering their own fat for dressings. They use fat trimmings from meat and chicken, rendering them through a grinder. Then it is melted in a double boiler and strained through a cloth. Keeping the grease in a cold place will prevent it from getting rancid. That's why it isn't a good idea to keep fat around in the hot kitchen—on the stove or in an open can—as many people do.
