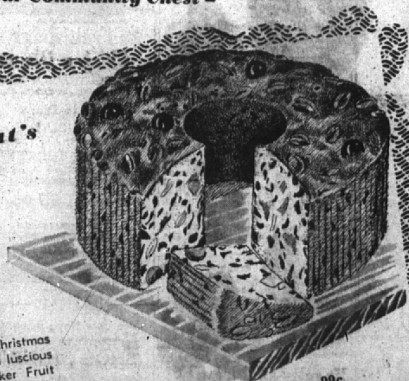

### Realtors Analyze Proposed Michigan Sales Tax Split

Members of the Birmingham Real Estate Board met Tuesday noon for luncheon at the Community House to hear their State Secretary, A. Saunders, from Lansing, present the "pro and con" in connection with Proposal No. 2 which will be on the forthcoming ballot November 6th.

Mr. Saunders stated that realtors advocated the passage of the amendment, believing that it was the only practical expedient today to assure some return to cities and school districts of a portion of the three per cent sales tax.

Birmingham, he estimated roughly, would receive about \$48,000.00 revenue return to the City Government if Proposal No. 2 adopted and the Birmingham School district roughly would receive about \$42,000.00. This money would be in addition to the regularly allocated support now received from the State.
