Election Tuesday, November 5, 1946

Among the various amendments to be voted on at this election will be an amendment to the Birmingham City Charter which is submitted by the City Commission and reads:

Shall Section 2 of Chapter II of the Charter of the City of Birmingham be amended by the addition of a new subsection to be known as subsection (4), the same to read as follows:

(4) For the acquiring, establishment, operation, extension, and maintenance of facilities for the storage and parking of vehicles within the corporate limits of the City of Birmingham, including the fixing and collection of charges for services and use thereof on a public utility basis, and for such purpose to acquire by gift, purchase, condemnation or otherwise the land necessary therefor.

This amendment is planned to give the City Commission specific authority to establish TIME PARKING LOTS—places where automobiles can be parked continuously longer than on the public streets. The necessity for establishing such TIME PARKING LOTS was first among the recommendations made Sept. 3, 1946 by the City Planning Commission to the City Commission for these reasons:—

1. Vacant property can be secured NOW in the Woodward-Maple four designated areas which will otherwise be built on immediately when commercial building restrictions are removed.
2. Such TIME PARKING LOTS are necessary for people who need a longer uninterrupted parking period than the hour limit given by a parking meter.
3. The growth in automobile registrations means that street parking will become crowded within two years.

THE BIRMINGHAM RETAIL MERCHANTS are in favor of the charter Amendment and trust it may have the support and an affirmative vote from all individuals who plan for and believe in a better Birmingham.
