Now living in Birmingham is a young bride, straight from Brussels, the woman taken to the American front by Renee Smith Wrons, nee Renee Smith, wife of former Sergeant Wrons, of the 8888 Central Postal Directory.

Renee and Bill were married in Brussels last March 25, first at a civil ceremony and then the morning and later at a Protestant church ceremony with an Army church commander.

Renee, who speaks English with only a slight accent, is dressed in a hand at a dance given by girls in Brussels for American, French and British troops.

At the dance, the young girls were allowed to dance with the soldiers as we wished but were not permitted to leave. Their parents exorted us—there was literally no chance of a Belgian girl being taken to the front by the Belgian," she explained.

**Invited to Home**

While the regulations are very strict concerning dates, they were not at all reluctant to have soldiers and their families come home.

When the Germans were in Bel-

your American stores fascinated me. In Brussels, the women take care of the stores and the men. Each store carries a different type of food or apparel and you visit from store to store in order to get what you want.

"Then, too, many women go to the shops and buy things and then sit out to sit down in the bakery shop and have a pastry and coffee and then go to the hairdresser's, cafes and open markets where you can eat. There are things you don't see here."

When questioned about the Belgian food situation, Renee said: "It's good as far as food is concerned, but it has been reported to be, although the food is good, it is not very good. They patronize the black market. At one time, when butter was scarce, they had to go to the city market. I came back from the country and my father brought me a cake and butter with two dollars and I had to pay for the cake money."

**Shipped to Germany**

When the Germans were in Bel-

often as Bill could get away from his nearby camp, he was a guest at the Simlar home.

"When we told my parents that we wished to be married, it was a different story," she recalled. "They were very reluctant to let their daughter marry an American and go all the way to the States."

Although at the time Renee, herself was a little frightened at the prospect, she would not admit it. Only now can she talk about how the long voyage over frightened her.

Bill was sent home by the Army. But before going he arranged for Renee's passage on the first boat possible.

She left Brussels April 23, after signing many documents and going through other official red tape. Traveling in Europe did not frighten her, for she had lived in Holland, Germany, France and other surrounding countries with her family before the war.

When she boarded the Z. E. Bulon France on May 7 and left the familiar port of Antwerp, however, it was with many misgivings.

**Arrives in New York**

"After six days at sea the ship put in at New York where Red Cross officials helped me and other war brides board proper planes, trains and automobiles to take us to our husbands. I finally arrived in Detroit May 21, and Bill met me.

Everything was so new and strange—New York and Detroit so different than foreign centers that she could not check her tears that came when she finally caught sight of him.

New friends met her here and has

had a chance to compare Birmingham and Brussels in her mind, there is no comparing them; she has decided.

"Why thare are so many differences—Brussels' streets are different, the buildings are all brick and stone, houses are built differently, higher and are more ornate, the stores are very different, and the people are not so friendly with outsiders," she exclaimed.

**Schools Very Different**

"Gie live much more life, here, even though Brussels is supposed to be a fairly modern European city. Schools are very different," she explained.

In Belgium, school begins at 8:30 and continues to 4:30, with an hour out for lunch. Time spent in school is spent in having classes with lectures and questions, and there is no such thing as a study hall. The teacher who brings homework home and it must be done, or the results are very amusing," she continued.

The girls go to the Lycee and the boys to the college (equivalent of our high school). While in school, if a girl or boy is seen in the unchaperoned company of another boy or girl, they are immediately expelled from the school—with literally no questions asked. Each student studies English, Flemish, German, Latin and Greek.
