

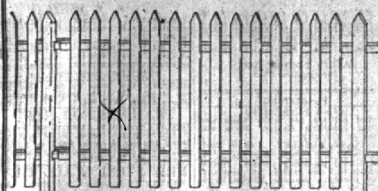
Will Remove Trees

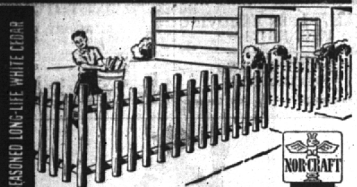

Joins Local Firm

Lawrence McKay, Jr., of Detroit and Clarkston, has been appointed manager to head the insurance department long maintained by Snyder, Buck & Bennett, Birmingham realtors. M. E. Snyder, president, announced this week. For some time the firm has provided insurance service to its clientele with many old-line companies. "Snyder, Buck & Bennett, having expanded their facilities and personnel materially in the last several years, determined that the insurance work should be consolidated under one head with a professional consultant available to its clients," Snyder stated in making his announcement.

Martin Sees Need of Improving Worth St.

There is a lot of traffic on Worth street when Oakland and Adams is closed during school hours, Commissioner Bill Martin has informed fellow commissioners.
This excessive traffic over this gravel road has been digging it up quite badly, and Commissioner Martin wondered if it should not have a permanent topping.
Because the Birmingham School Board had, at one time, requested the permanent closing of Oakland between Adams and Worth, the Commission instructed City Manager Egbert to contact the School Board concerning the present status of their request before taking any action on Commissioner Martin's proposal.

Five Old City Cars Will Be Replaced

Six antiquated or worn out city vehicles will be replaced just as soon as possible, it has been decided by the City Commission, as it authorized Donald C. Egbert, city manager, to ask for bids for seven assorted city vehicles, six of which will replace the old automobiles.
A coupe, four pick-up trucks and a sedan are the six vehicles which will be replaced. The seventh is an additional sedan which will serve as transportation for several departments, personnel of which have been required to use their private cars on a mileage basis.

"We are establishing more complete cost records for our equipment," Egbert told commissioners. "Of course, such records are of little value for comparative basis on the old equipment."

Students to Enjoy School Savings Plan

With the resumption of school classes, Birmingham students will be given the opportunity to use the countrywide School Savings Program to save their money and put it into Government Bonds, according to Dr. Dwight E. Ireland, superintendent of schools.
"This program has been carried on in all the Birmingham schools since the beginning of the war," Ireland stated. "But during the last year, after peace was announced, savings in the schools took a sharp drop."
"Our teachers and instructors will explain the program as they have in the past. But now that war is over, the students do not seem greatly interested in it."
