223 New Students Include One From Oxford, England

The opening of school finds 635 students attending Baldwin this year. This number is less than last year's enrollment, which was 663. In addition to the 160 new sophomores from Barnum, there are 21 new 10th, either new to Birmingham or entering from private schools. One member of this class is John Chesney, who came to Birmingham from Oxford, England.

There is a total of 63 new students, including two members of the graduating class. These boys, war veterans, are Jerry Bosley and Charles Harding.

Besides these two veterans, there are six other former servicemen enrolled in classes from 10A to 12A and one post-graduate student. They are Harry Blumst, Frank Delahunty, Dan Herron, Dean McAllister, John Voorheis, and Robert Watts.

Among the new students are 13 juniors, 14 seniors, two 10As and 11As.

All parts of the country are represented by the new students, although, the greatest number come from nearby areas. Among the 38 from Michigan are seven each from Royal Oak and Detroit, six from Pontiac, five from Vaughan, three each from Cranbrook and Kingswood two each from Monroe and Grosse Pointe, and one each from Keego Harbor, Rochester, Ferndale, Farmington, Redford, and Walled Lake.

Other students came from Florida, California, Massachusetts, Ohio, Indiana, New York, Arizona, and Washington, D. C.

Washington Trip Set For Next April 3rd

The annual Washington trip will be resumed this year and is expected to draw many Baldwinites since more than 100 students signified their interest last spring. The trip will be slated for April 3 and will include stops at Williamsburg, New York, Washington, Old Point Comfort, Alexandria, and Niagara Falls.
