Cranbrook School Has 191 Students, 3 New Instructors

Last week 191 boys representing 20 states, one possession, and two foreign countries arrived at Cranbrook School in Bloomfield Hills, to begin the school's 10th year of instruction.

From Hawaii's Maui Island came a student to enter the 9th grade, while Peru and Sweden are represented by a senior and a post-graduate student. These boarding students will join 111 schoolmates from the school's

vicinity. Ninety-six new students are enrolled, including two veterans of World War II.

W. Brooke Stabler, headmaster of the school, announces the addition of three new members of the faculty. They are Walter G. Petke, who teaches German; Frederick W. Campbell, Jr., history; and Charles E. Holt, Jr., who joined the English department.

Coincidentally, all three are graduates of Dartmouth College in New Hampshire and have served in different branches of the armed forces. Petke was formerly on the faculty of Rutgers University Prep School in New Jersey.

Returning from Army service, Hubert V. Davis is teaching mathematics at Cranbrook this year. Major Davis left the school in 1945 to serve in the Coast Guard Auxiliary Corps of the Army.

Cranbrook War Memorial Plaque Is Unveiled

Ceremony Dedicates Scholarship Fund As Living Memorial

At an impressive noon ceremony, the War Memorial Scholarship Fund plaque of Cranbrook School, Bloomfield Hills, was unveiled Friday in the presence of the faculty and students.

In his opening remarks, W. Brooke Stabler, Headmaster of Cranbrook School, said: "This plaque will remind us, as we pass along these walks, of the quality of which Cranbrook has made and of the sacrifices of 683 alumni. It is tangible evidence of the honor for which Cranbrook has always stood. As the living memorial, it founded the Cranbrook School War Memorial Scholarship Fund. During the years, many boys will have the advantages of Cranbrook because of the tribute we pay to use 683 whose names are enshrined here."

Harry D. Hoey, director, and Frank Wernken, associate director of the fund raising program, unveiled the plaque which stands at the base of Cranbrook tower facing the quadrangle. The Rev. Walter H. Young of Christ Church Cranbrook gave the dedication prayer, after which taps were sounded.

The large bronze plaque bears the inscription: "The Cranbrook Alumni Association here records the names of its members who fought for their country in World War II, and in whose honor has been established the Cranbrook School War Memorial Scholarship Fund." Following this are the names of the 37 alumni who gave their lives and the 646 who served in the various branches of the armed forces.
