

## Federal Savings And Loan In New Hanna Offices

A step which was contemplated more than 2½ years ago materialized Tuesday morning as the Birmingham Federal Savings and Loan Association opened in its new location in the Hanna Building at Woodward and Maple avenues.

"While the remodeling of our new location is the best that we can do under present government building restrictions, our future plans include new counters and cages, redecorating of the exterior and the installation of a revolving door," stated Walter Moreland, president of the Association.

He explained that the association had planned this move as far back as December, 1944, when they purchased the building, but couldn't move in because of existing leases.

Organized in June, 1935, the original \$5,000 capital has passed the \$2,000,000 mark with the date of the opening of the new quarters, Moreland announced.

Other officers of the association besides Moreland are Emerson C. Brown, chairman; John McKee, vice president; Hazel E. Lawrence, secretary-treasurer. Members of the Board include Ralph C. Moulton, Charles N. Zylman, Clyde C. Bennett, Emory O. Hattan and Howard W. Warner.

able water for 30 or 40 years and may continue to be a satisfactory supply for many more years beyond this period.

3. The water elevation in the well is 800 feet above sea level and is approximately 20 feet above the intersection of Woodward and Maple and this will result in low production costs.

More Accurate Data Later  
"I suggest we exercise our option on this well and proceed with the formulation of plans for the development of the wells and mains leading into the city," Egbert told Commissioners. "To develop a well and the necessary mains in the city and leading into the city will cost approximately \$150,000. A more accurate figure can be determined when our engineering studies are completed."

"In order to finance this construction, it is recommended that the City issue bonds, either revenue or general obligation, in an amount of approximately \$125,000. The balance would be financed out of the reserve set up in the Water Department for this purpose and out of departmental revenue."

Egbert stated that the Water Department estimates were approximately \$23,000. He also indicated that the well on the Peabody site would not be in operation until 1948.

In line with Egbert's recommendation, the Commission instructed Russell T. Berger, City Treasurer, to recommend the type of bonds to be issued, taking into consideration the possible interest rates which can be secured on the different types and the ability of the Water Department to pay off this obligation.

and the problems and work them out—just as they do their job."

Charles S. Rust, former member of the plan commission, remarked, "Long as this problem now is a private citizen and not as a member of the plan commission, it will be in operation until 1948."

Now that school is about to reopen and the long summer vacation is almost over, it means increased responsibilities for parents as well as students, according to a statement received by Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, Birmingham superintendent of schools, from George E. Carrothers, director of the University of Michigan's bureau of cooperation with educational institutions.

Among the major reasons for high school failures are the heavy load carried by teachers, parental unconcern for the education of their children and community misunderstanding of real education, Carrothers states.

In line with Carrothers' statement, Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, superintendent of the Birmingham schools, points out that Birmingham parents are equally as negligent as those from other cities.



"It is true that all young people need social life, and I would actually go so far as to say that weekend assignments should be made lighter so that young people can relax with almost no schoolwork over the week end."

"However, during the week there should be time spent at home on school work. The student's job is to study and prepare himself for his adult life, and parents who do not realize that are on the wrong track."

Dr. Ireland pointed out numerous examples to further exemplify this lack of paternal concern for the student's education, welfare. Among them was a young boy who had not done too well in Birmingham schools, and had asked for a transfer to another school. His request was granted.

Wants to Re-Enter  
"Now he has come back to Birmingham, asking to be allowed to re-enter school," Ireland declared. "After several years of fumbling, the boy has figured out for himself that he wants and needs a good education, and is willing to work for it."

The boy's parents have never visited the school or contacted any of the school personnel in order to straighten out his difficulties and put him on the right road, Ireland pointed out.

"If there is any question in your mind about Johnny's work," he concluded, "visit the school, talk with his teachers and find out how he is coming along. They are willing and anxious to cooperate with you, but when there is no cooperation, can only do what they think is right. Remember that school days are work days for the student, and insist that some time be spent each night with school books. Your Johnny is laying the foundation of his life now, and you should help him."
