60-Pound Limit. Garden rubbish must be placed in containers of wood, metal or paper. All branches must be cut to four-foot lengths and tied securely into bundles to facilitate handling.

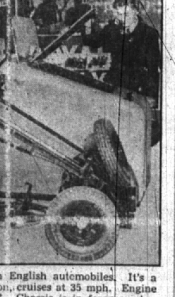
The outlined provisions of the ordinance listed above apply to industrial and construction concerns as well as to individual property owners.

School District's Bonded Indebtedness Will Be Paid Off by 1952, Says Reese

(Editorial Note: This week The Eccentric presents the fifth in a series of articles being written by members of the Birmingham Board of Education, explaining the present situation of the Birmingham public schools and the Board's request that the school district retain the present 2 1/2% mill levy for school operational costs. In this article, Roland W. Reese, elected to the School Board in June 1946, in the present status of the district's bonded indebtedness.)

In considering the total financial picture of the Birmingham Public Schools, one could scarcely omit the outstanding bonded indebtedness since the late twenties.

All bonds due and callable on October 1st of each year have been paid, and interest on all outstanding obligations has been paid semi-annually as due.

Have a Reserve Fund A reserve fund has been set up in the name of the Birmingham Public Schools, and interest on the debt service account to meet future obligations of the school district is invested in government bonds which bring in more revenue than they cost in interest on outstanding obligations.

By means of this sinking fund, an amount has been accumulated which is sufficient to retire all bonds due from 1952 to 1956 in installments.

Thus, by the careful planning of your Board of Education, the debt structure has been reduced to obligations of the next four years, at the end of which the entire outstanding debt of this school district will be liquidated.

Debt Millage Going Down In the meantime, you have noticed that the millage rate for the service has gone down year by year until now it is only two and one-half mills.

It can be said, as a result, that the financial picture is most encouraging. It has been reduced to obligations of the next four years, at the end of which the entire outstanding debt of this school district will be liquidated.

By a continuation of the present millage for operating the schools, the best professional service can be maintained at a reasonable size which will result in effective instruction, and the many activities in addition to the three which can be provided which will make educational experience in Birmingham as rich as in other first-rate school systems in the state and nation.

A normal day's work load prior to the strike was approximately 38,000 completed local calls and about 9,000 toll calls outside the city.

Parents Can Help This service has dropped, because of the fact that about 1,000 emergency calls a day and 400 emergency toll completions.

Parents should not pick up their phone to listen to the recording which is repeated every time a phone is removed from the hook.

Most of the time these children pick up the phone several times in quick succession. The flashing light on the switchboard indicates to the operator that there is an emergency call coming through when such isn't the case," he pointed out.
