Adjutant General of Michigan Answers Questions on Filling Out Bonus Forms

Last week saw the beginning of filing Michigan Veterans' Bonus applications at counseling centers, at veterans' service organizations, at many other agencies throughout Michigan.

These are questions... Right now the questions are mostly how to fill out the blanks. Here are answers to some outstanding questions, based on information received from the Adjutant General of Michigan.

From Gogebic County comes the question: In the upper left hand corner of the application blank appears a space for claim number. Does this mean the Veterans Administration/claim number? A. Do not fill in this blank; it is not a federal claim number at all. It is the number the Adjutant General is going to assign to the particular bonus application.

W.A.A.C. Need Affidavit. A veteran in Algonk asks: I have two honorable discharges for two periods of service. What do I do? A. If you have two discharges, you will need to file an application for each discharge. There is only one exception to this, and the answer to that comes in a question from a Women's Army Corps veteran.

How can I give evidence of my service in the W.A.A.C.? A. It is necessary only to file an affidavit as to this service in the W.A.A.C. The affidavit must be notarized and it is of course preferable that the W.A.A.C. show a copy of orders placing her in the W.A.A.C. and then come back in the affidavit to make only one application, accompanied by the affidavit of service in the W.A.A.C. If her period of service was broken, it will be necessary to make two applications.

How Officers Get Bonus. This comes from a counselor in Southwestern Michigan: What about an enlisted man who was discharged and accepts a commission? He fills out an application blank for his enlisted service and another application for his service as an officer. Both forms should be clipped together and submitted together. The Notary Public should endorse "CERTIFIED FOR MICHIGAN VETERANS' MILITARY PAY" on both discharge certificate and the officer's Certificate of Service.

From Detroit, this question: A veteran's service was all as an officer; what should he do? A. He attaches a notarized copy of his Certificate of Service to page 3 of the application blank and fills out the information asked

for on page 4 from the data contained on the back of his Certificate of Service.

This is from a counselor in the western part of the state: A veteran submitted a photostat of his discharge certificate and asked me to fill out his application. The answer is this: The counselor must insist that the veteran submit the original discharge certificate so that the words "CERTIFIED FOR MICHIGAN VETERANS' MILITARY PAY" can be endorsed upon the discharge by a Notary Public who completes the veteran's bonus application for him.

About Lost Discharges. Here is a question asked frequently: What happens if a veteran lost his discharge and it was not registered? A. It will be necessary for him to furnish a Certificate in Lieu of Lost Discharge.

There is another part to that question: A lost discharge, but the original discharge was recovered by the County Clerk. The Adjutant General has indicated that he will accept a certificate from the County Clerk in lieu of a lost discharge, but a certified copy photostatic copy accompanying this certificate must be a copy of the original and so certified by the County Clerk. And, when the bonus application is submitted, the endorsement "CERTIFIED FOR MICHIGAN VETERANS' MILITARY PAY" must be endorsed on

the certificate from the County Clerk.

Here is the answer to another question which has been asked frequently. If you are asked to witness a veteran's application, do not fail to put down your street address as well as the name of your city.

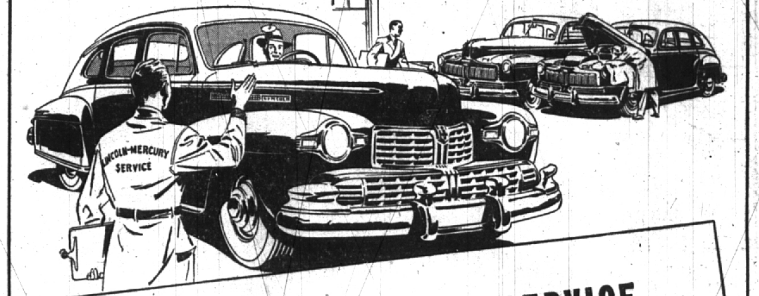
