**Kingswood Students To Present Recital**

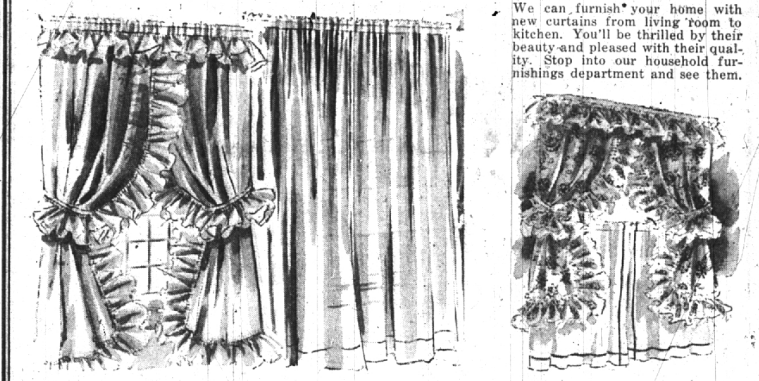
Plans students of Miss Grace Emery will present a recital in the auditorium of Kingswood School Sunday evening, April 20, at 8 p. m.
