Now You Can Hire A Maid, Thanks to The Phone Strike

Do you need a maid, a trained or practical nurse, a couple, gardener or part time workers? Of perhaps a baby sitter? If so the telephone strike is your golden opportunity for lack of phone communication has put the supply in excess of demand at the Community House Employment Office for the first time in several years. Miss Lucy Bean, director of the office, announced this week. Job applicants have been coming as usual but employers, phone conditioned, have stayed away by scores, she explained. During the month of March the Community House office handled more than 420 phone calls to bring 183 employers and job seekers together, 70 of them in permanent arrangement. Seven of the employed were full-time maids and eight were trained or practical nurses. The employment office offers a free service and is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a. m. until noon.
