Like Alice in Wonderland, Mayor George Welsh of Grand Rapids visited Michigan's capitol at Lansing last week. He conferred with Governor Kim Sigler. He then uttered this bit of political wisdom and financial nonsense: "I don't think you have a financial problem."

The next day the Governor appeared before the state Legislature. He delivered a second budget message. He quoted the state budget director (who ought to know what he is talking about) that the State of Michigan will have only \$145,000,000 from available resources with which to pay \$228,000,000 in expenditures.

"It is a simple matter of arithmetic," said Governor Sigler. "I don't think you have a financial problem. All of which is certainly confusing to the Deans, the man on the street."

Mayor Welsh is no dumb bunny. He was elected president of the National Conference of Mayors. He is regarded as a "big shot" public official of national standing.

Now the Grand Rapids mayor arrived at his bit of financial wisdom.

Mayor Edward J. Jeffries of Detroit likewise scoffed at the governor's prediction that Michigan, the great arsenal of democracy, is headed for a multi-million deficit. The budget director at Lansing estimates that there will be a surplus of \$17,000,000 in the general fund on July 1, 1947. Subtract this sum from an overall deficit of \$83,000,000 and you have a shortage of \$66,000,000.

Only according to Mayor Welsh, you wouldn't have a deficit at all. "I don't think you have a financial problem," he opined.

Confronted with such political warring from his big city mayors, Governor Sigler chose to recommend new taxes rather than to resort to deficit financing.

"Many people have the misconception that there are available for general fund appropriations large balances in our treasury," said Governor Sigler in his legislative message. "Few people seem to have any accurate knowledge of the manner in which the revenues available to the state are being spent."

If the public is woefully ignorant of the financial facts at Lansing, then Mayor Welsh is politically smart to tag the onus of new taxes on Governor Sigler and the current state legislature. "There is no financial problem at Lansing. The state has many millions in reserves, all waiting to be spent. No new taxes are needed. Eliminate waste in government at Lansing. Elect a new governor and clean houses." (And so forth in good political ballbooy style)

The state legislature arrives at the point in the road where it must choose between deficit financing and a balanced budget via new taxes.

Deficit financing is spending more than the state has in the bank. National government at Washington resorted to deficit financing because it possessed the power to create currency, to sell bonds or bonds and Nancy C Hart, 415 Argyle, was ticketed at 45 miles in a 25-mile zone.

Politics suggests deficit financing until financial needs of the state are definitely known even to politicians such as Mayor Welsh. Sigler would accept the situation as it exists, levy new taxes and balance the budget.

Handicapping the latter is the popular illusion of an ever-mounting surplus at Lansing and the economic fallacy that tax money received from Lansing is not "our money"; it is a contribution and will: hence get all you can while the getting is good; if you don't get your share, the state will spend it for something else.

This illusion of the "either/less" money" has been breaking down responsibility in government. The prospective \$66,000,000 deficit at Lansing is a prime example.

## Police Ticket Five Speeders Last Week

Speeding arrests were issued to five drivers during the past week by Birmingham police. Arthur W Collins of Glenbury Circle was ticketed doing 40 miles per hour in a 25-mile zone; John K. Duncan Detroit received one when going 45 miles an hour in a 30-mile zone; George W. Malchett, Detroit, was also ticketed at 60 in a 45-zone; Gilbert J. Dolan, Detroit, was arrested doing 60 miles an hour in a 45-mile zone; and Nancy C Hart, 415 Argyle, was ticketed at 45 miles in a 25-mile zone.
