Sports Showup

By H. Bisset, Jr. Birmingham will have only one man this year on the U. of M. football team. Former star Hugh Black of the '40 team is the only local who so far has reported for spring practice. In 1943 Hugh won his varsity letter at Michigan. He also was a letter winner in wrestling.

The annual award to the basketball player making the highest number of free throws went this year to star guard Jack Phillips, who had a .600 percentage in this field to take top honors. Weather permitting, all the boys out for baseball and track have been putting forth a lot of effort in an attempt to get their respective grounds in shape for the coming season this week.

To encourage attendance at the baseball games and track meets this year, bleachers will be set up for the baseball games and possibly a public address system and bleachers for the track meets.

The University of Detroit will have two former Birmingham football captains out for the varsity this fall. Reported for spring practice were Cliff Blashman and Bob Little.

Of the 70-odd track hopefuls turned out for the year, Coach Lloyd A. Cooper has chosen to take many meets this year. Because of the heavy schedule, everything is very slow in getting started this season, but all schools participating are in the same position so all have the same disadvantage.

Jack Philser, '46 state champion, sprained his ankle last week and was out of the River Rouge Invitational at Ann Arbor last Saturday. He will also be unable to compete in the first two meets of the season. When ready for competition, he should shatter the 140 record this year.

In the Medley Relay at Ann Arbor last Saturday, Bill Hickman taking the baton in the last lap, the three quarter mile run he was running fourteenth in a field of twenty. In the long run Bill finished taking first by a margin of six inches—a feat to take 13 men and still not take first place.

The River Rouge Invitational is said to be the largest prep track and field meet in the state run off in one day. About 1,100 boys participate.
