

175 More Donors Needed If City Is to Provide Its Share of County Plasma

Oakland County hospitals, which for the past two years have been using injections of blood plasma as an emergency measure to save patients' lives, are fast using up all present supplies of the plasma, it was learned today.

If new supplies are not made available by blood donations from residents in the County, the hospitals are in actual danger of not having a plasma bank on hand.

In order to forestall this possibility, and to give Birmingham an opportunity to help build up the hospital plasma banks at St. Joseph's Mercy, Pontiac General, Oakland County Tuberculosis Sanatorium, Oakland County Hospital and Royal Oak General Hospital, the Michigan Department of Health, through facilities of the Red Cross, will stage a two-day blood donation clinic next Monday and Tuesday in the Municipal Building.

Need Many More Donors

The clinic, organized so that it may handle upwards of 300 blood donors, is now being scheduled for 125 donations.

Last year and the year before, blood plasma was made available free to Birmingham residents who needed it through the courtesy of
