Students Attend Engineering Meet Held in Detroit

For the guidance of prospective young engineers, the Engineering Society of Detroit presented its twelfth annual Engineering and Science Vocational Guidance meeting at the Horace H. Rackham Educational Memorial building in Detroit last week.

Adding to attendance of several hundred high schools boys, Larned, Goodrich, counselor of boys at Baldwin, and nine students including Dick Jeffers, Norman Goddard, Bruce Smiley, Bob Brungraber, Bob Morgan, Knight Houghton, Frank Lyndall, Robert Sausser and Edgar Stretten, spent an interesting day gaining valuable information.

The address was given by Dr. Harry Stanley Rogers, president of the Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn.

Need Complete Interest

Dr. Rogers' topic was "Shall I Choose Engineering?" and he emphasized to the audience the need of a complete interest in engineering and the desire to stick with that occupation.

Immediately after the address, counselors and students went to rooms in the building where a vocational adviser from every branch of engineering was present to answer questions and recommend colleges.

There were 18 different types of engineering represented. The students were permitted to visit rooms where those designated on their entrance card to obtain information if they were undecided as to the exact branch they were planning to follow.

Dean O'Ferrall to Speak at Christ Church Tomorrow

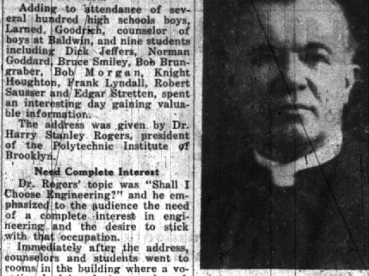

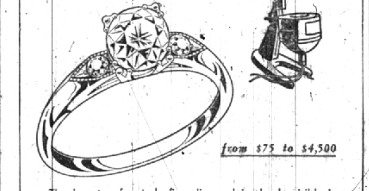
