**HOW TO Rabies (Part 2)**

The control and eradication of rabies has long been a subject of controversy among public health workers. The early attempts at the use of a rabies vaccination in dogs was only about 40 per cent efficient. However, the extensive work done by the Rockefeller Institute has resulted in the production in the past few years of an improved and efficient vaccine. It is the definite opinion of most workers that rabies can be eradicated completely in this country through a definite program which entails compulsory vaccination of all dogs and complete elimination of all strays. Either procedure alone has shown to be of little material value in the control of rabies. Rockefeller Institute in conjunction with the State of Alabama has reduced the number of rabies cases in that state from an average of 900 cases a year in the years 1932 through 1936 to 221 cases in the year 1939. In Texas, the City of Houston using only control measure reports an incidence of nearly 600 cases among approximately 75,000 dogs up to 1941. However, in nearby Beaumont, using vaccination and control measures, there is no rabies problem among the dogs or citizens. Rabies can and should be eliminated. Local authorities can pass legislation to remedy the situation. A community that is lax in its rabies control is not offering a complete, efficient public health service to its citizens.
