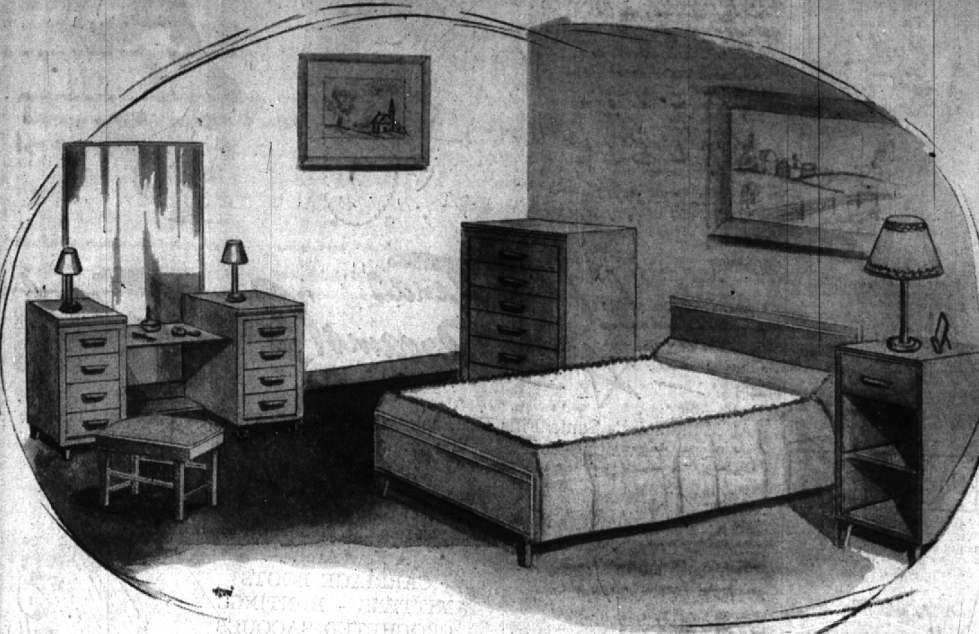

Ranch Room Helps Community House to New Record



November attendance at the Ranch Room of the Community House jumped to 2,162, helping to swell total attendance at the civic center to a new high, more than 17,000 persons last month. Mrs. Velma Isley, director of the Community House, informed the board at its Monday meeting.

December events may carry the attendance record even higher. Mrs. Isley said in describing holiday schedules which provide special events for young people, these "refreshers" courses in including "refreshers" courses in social dancing for the college and university students, a Christmas dinner with instrumental music and community singing which is expected to bring an unusually large crowd to the family dinner on Thursday, December 18.

The Charles Edward Post No. 44, American Legion, and its Auxiliary are sponsoring the nationwide "Give to the Yank Who Gave" drive for Christmas gifts to hospitalized veterans in hospitals throughout the country.

There are 70 such hospitals in Michigan, with 8,000 men confined to them. Legionnaires say this will be the biggest Christmas "party" in history and are inviting the people of Birmingham to join them in an expression of thanks and good cheer to these men.

A collection depot has been set up in the Legion Home at 266 South Woodward avenue, where gifts may be left at any time up to Dec. 15. The largest part of this drive for the Legion members, will be to collect and deliver the gifts. All will be distributed through the hospitals for Christmas day. Residents who care to participate in the local drive, can further assist by bringing the gifts wrapped, ready for delivery.

Each hospitalized veteran will receive a gift box, the value of which will vary between four and five dollars. This is the fourth year that the "Give to the Yank Who Gave" program has been in effect, and each year has seen it greatly increased over the preceding years, due to the steady increase in hospitals, and hospitalized men.

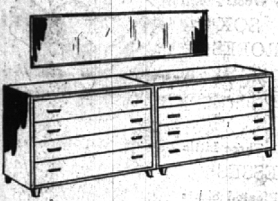

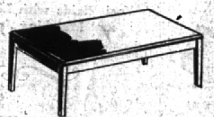

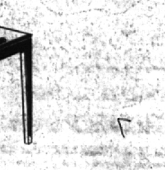
