Cranbrook School Portrays Ancient Christmas Customs

Combining ancient and medieval customs, the annual Cranbrook School Christmas Pageant held Wednesday carried out in the traditional manner to herald the Christmas season.

To open the festivities, Mike Mooney, as the scarlet-clad Jester, lead the guests from the Commons Room to seats in the evergreen decorated Great Hall which was illuminated with candles.

The Glee Club and Lower School Chorus, clad in shepherd's clothes followed John Peirson, carrying the Star of Bethlehem, to the manger where the Christmas story was enacted. Talcott Jones, Peter Northrup and Peter Hight were the three Kings of the Orient.

In Feudal Manner
The second part of the pageant followed the manner of celebration in the old feudal estates of England as the lord received his knights and vassals at a banquet, entertained by minstrels and the Court Jester.

Trumpet notes interrupted the feasting to announce the approach of the "Procession of the Board's Head" led by Laird Stabler, Glee Club president. Then followed the "Procession of the Plum Pudding" as group-clad revelers entered with a blissing plum pudding to the strains of "Cranbrook Bids You Welcome." The revelers appeared again, this time bearing the Yule Log astride which the Jester rode.

The feast concluded, the Lower School Mummer's Play, combination of the St. George plays as done by mummers in different parts of England, was presented, followed by an address by W. Brooks Stabler, headmaster.

In accordance with Cranbrook tradition, Santa presented his girls in the Commons Room, presiding the procession to the movie, which terminated the festivities.

World Affairs Pamphlets at Public Library

How can I get the facts? . . . on the Marshall Plan, the Krug Report, the Monnet plan, the ERP? Even during this gayest of holiday seasons, these questions come with increasing frequency to the desk of Baldwin Public Library. Birmingham as a community seems vitally interested in the rehabilitation of Europe and the whole subject is being studied by individuals, clubs and civic organizations.

Cooperating with the Community Council's plan for an intensive study of the problem next month, the Library staff is assembling a quantity of pamphlets and books which will be kept together as long as the demand lasts.

Divided into Discussions
The pamphlets are roughly divided into discussions of the Marshall plan, and the practical aspects of carrying it out. Included are such items as the Krug report, the Department of State publications on the resources of each state of the Union, indicating what goods each is best able to export, The Foreign Policy Association reports and reprints of important magazine articles. New pamphlets will be added as they are released. Other material is easily obtained from current magazines, of which the Library has a good many.

The pamphlet collection is placed in the alcove off the Main Reading room of the Library and may be consulted at any time.
