Research Wins Pope Medal for Dr. C. C. Deam

On Thursday, the Cranbrook Institute of Science will hold its annual Members night at 9 p.m. At this time, the museum will be open to members and guests holding invitations. Some new exhibits will be on display. Highlight of the evening will be the presentation of the second Mary Soper Pope medal to Dr. Charles C.

Deam, botanist from Buffington, Ind.

Granted in recognition of noteworthy and outstanding accomplishment in the field of the plant science, the presentation will be made by Gustavus D. Pope, a member of the Institute's Board since its inception. The medal was designed by Marshall Fredericks, Birmingham sculptor, and the first medal was awarded Frans Ver Doorn of Waltham, Mass. last year.

Dr. Deam holds an Sc.D. from De Pauw University and an L.L.D. from the University of Indiana. He has been a pharmacist and an officer of the Buffington bank. Nearly forty years ago, Dr.

Deam became Indiana State Forester and in 1928 was appointed Indiana Research Forester, a post he held until his retirement in 1940.

The usefulness of Dr. Deam's short technical papers and published work extends far beyond the boundaries of his native state, although he has confined his active lifetime to botanizing on that region.

The thoroughness of his survey can be illustrated by the fact that he has collected in every township of Indiana and no one in the state has collected more in any single county than Deam himself.

Through the years, Dr. Deam has followed botanical literature and kept the nomenclature of Indiana plants constantly at its most modern state of development.

He is the author of "Trees of Indiana," "Grasses of Indiana," "Shrubs of Indiana" and in 1940 his "Flora of Indiana" was published by the Conservation Commission.
