

County Committee Is Distributing Christmas Seals

The Tuberculosis Christmas Seal, depicting the ox team and the double-barred cross, have been mailed to hundreds of families in the Birmingham-Bloomfield Hills area as the 11th annual Christmas Seals sale opens.

"Each letter contains seals and a message telling of the work of the Oakland County Tuberculosis Association during the past year," Dr. John S. Lambie, 280 Aspen, local representative to the association, stated this week.

"Such services as the mobile X-ray survey, a permanent free X-ray clinic in Pontiac and Royal Oak for all Oakland County residents, control nurses, and the education program for tuberculosis patients, radio health education programs and many other services were paid for by Christmas Seal funds."

In 1903, he said, the idea to use a Christmas seal to provide funds to wage the fight against tuberculosis was conceived in Denmark. A young public health worker in Wilmington Del., began the use of Christmas Seals in the United States in 1907. Since that time the funds from the sale of Christmas Seals have been instrumental in lowering the death rate from tuberculosis by two-thirds; the remaining one-third of the work will be difficult—there is still much work left to do.

DREAMS BEING FULFILLED
"The dream that tuberculosis may some day be eliminated is in the process of fulfillment," A. R. Munson, Executive Secretary of the Oakland County Tuberculosis Association said, "but the time is not yet for over 1800 of us in Michigan will die of tuberculosis during 1947. The job of saving lives from needless death is far from done."

Eighty-four per cent of the funds are used in Oakland County, and the remaining going to help support state and national associations where large scale printing of educational material, national-wide co-operative planning, medical research and such work as needs to be done on other than local levels is carried out. Dr. Lambie explained.

Mrs. Staley was born in Pana, Ill., and came to this vicinity 19 years ago. She was married to Joseph T. Staley 50 years ago.

The survivors are three sons, Arthur and George of Birmingham, and Alton of Berkeley; one daughter, Mrs. Frank Wiley of Royal Oak and six grandchildren.

Funeral arrangements are, as yet, incomplete.

Orson Leonard, 32, died Monday in St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac. He underwent an appendectomy there two weeks ago, and was recovering nicely, when pneumonia set in.
