Club Notes
The Birmingham Business Women will hold their regular meeting Thursday evening, Dec. 4, in the Community House at 6:45 p. m.
The Detroit Federation of Women's Clubs, of which the Birmingham Women's Club is a member, will hold an all-day meeting at their club house on Second boulevard on Tuesday, Dec. 11.
Four divisions are planned for the morning session, which will begin at 10 o'clock. In the art division, Franklin Page of the Detroit Institute of Art's educational staff, and well known for his work in water colors, will speak on "The Modern Word as Seen by the Artist." Mrs. Carl J. Baller, librarian at the Detroit Garden Center, will exhibit rare old books on gardening, as well as new publications, to illustrate her talk on "Fresche Garden Reading."
The talk on International Relations will be given by Harry Hwang, native Korean, whose topic is the present crisis in Korea, one of the issues now before the U.N. Speaking for the dramatic division of the literary groups, Paul Kaczander of Wayne University's radio department, will talk on "Education in Radio."
At 11:45, Mrs. Lillian Hicks will present "The Voyage of the Wee Red Cap," by Ruth Sawyer. The presentation will be accompanied by special music, composed by Henrietta Bodycombe, who will play her own composition Gertrude Waterhouse, pianist, will be the accompanist for Albert Larson's violin solos.
The meeting will reconvene at 2 o'clock to hear a discussion of the Taft-Hartley Act by August Scholle, president of the Michigan CIO Council, and George S. Fitzgerald, attorney for the Teamsters' Union, AFL. They will speak from the standpoint of Labor.
Mrs. Alice Gorham will speak on "Public Relations and Motion Pictures." Mrs. Lawrence Hicker, representing social welfare, will tell of the work being done by the city's daughters of the Sons of the Aged. Anne Campbell will read some of her timely poems.
The evening session, which will meet at 7:30, will hear Miss Marcella Meurer, exchange teacher in Scotland, who has visited 19 different countries, tell of "Experiences of an Exchange Teacher."
