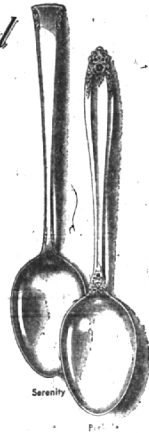

Detroiters Will Speak to Garden Club on Monday

Mrs. Clarence W. Avery of Detroit will be the featured speaker at the next meeting of the Garden Club of Michigan, which will take place at the Hall of Christ Church Cranbrook on Monday, March 3, at two o'clock.

Mrs. Avery, a noted authority on conservation, is committee chairman of conservation of the Federated Garden Club of Michigan which is sponsoring and providing scholarships for either grade, high or rural school teachers.

Mrs. Avery will present the plan of the committee whereby teachers may be sent to the Higgins Lake Training School, a part of the Michigan department of conservation, during the last week in June, through donations from each garden club in Michigan.

Her talk on general conservation of national resources will cover soil, forest, mineral and home conservation. She states that conservation is next to horticulture in garden club work and that the whole nation is becoming more "conservation conscious."
