'Court Musician' Free-Scoring Games Mark This Week's Church League Play

In three free-scoring games, First Methodist, Embury Methodist and St. James Episcopal basketball teams rolled over their opponents on the Barnum Junior High floor, in the YMCA Inter-Church League. First Methodist led Holy Name all the way as Appel and Pope found the range, Saffell and Red Dunn aided the Red and White in keeping the score close. Embury Methodist used a fast break employing long passes to run up a 26-16-3 half-time score on First Baptist. Substituting freely, they coasted to a 43-13 victory. Williams played a beautiful floor game for the Baptists and netted 18 points. Saffell contributed 17 points to the Methodist's total. St. James lost no time in running up a comfortable lead on Franklin Community after being held to a 16-10-9 half-time score. Franklin suffered from lack of reserves and fell by a score of 41 to 11. A Mutual Problem, City Will Service Homes Beyond Limits

Two houses on Adams road, just outside the City limits of Birmingham, on the Porritt property will be connected to the Birmingham water and sewerage systems, the City Commission has decided. The house at 459 Adams, connected to the sewer system, had requested water connection. The owners have been asked to abate this nuisance, but appear to have no way to except by annexation to the Birmingham sewerage system. Considerable discussion of the city's policy not to extend sewer and water services to homes outside the corporate limits followed, with Mayor Milton F. Mallender pointing out that some time ago the property owners had been asked to come into the city but had refused. "We don't like to apply pressure, but this problem is a mutual one," City and property-owner one, Mayor Mallender said. "Maybe if the service is extended, the owners will decide to come into the city at an earlier date."
