

Co-operation With Peru Urged in Talk by Lawrence C. Good

Lawrence C. Good, B.S., of the Detroit Inter-American Council, addressed Rotary clubs when they met at the home of Mrs. John D. Snyder on Michigan drive Monday, Jan. 20, at 1 p.m.

His subject was "Peru, from the Pacific to the Amazon." A resident of Peru for four and a half years, Good has a knowledge of the customs and problems of the country. He spoke of it as one of the most colorful in the southern hemisphere.

Still under a feudal system, the majority of the people have no right to vote or own land, a condition which, in his opinion, breeds revolt.

Pointing out how Peru aided us materially during the war in providing tin, guano and other things, Good urged the need of a better understanding of the country's need for present and future co-operation.

There are no immediate plans for the wedding.

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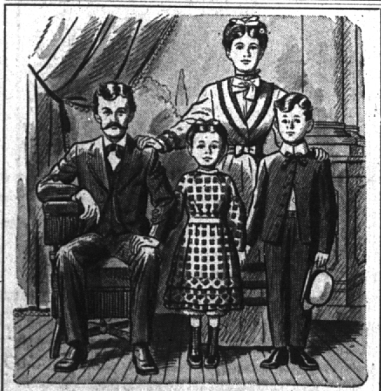
