

### Detroit to Show Explain Planned Visual Aids to Parenthood Work Pierce PTA Group to Campaigners

Pierce PTA members tonight at 8 p.m. at the school, will enjoy a program built about audio-visual education, a subject which the Board suggested early in the fall as the appropriate project for PTA study this year.

Mrs. McEvoy cited the high maternal and infant death figures in Wayne County this past year which were largely due to the fact that babies were improperly spaced, resulting in the poor health of the mothers.

**Economic Insecurity**

Mrs. Vera C. Hurland, director of the Michigan and Detroit Leagues, spoke on the social problems encountered through her work with Planned Parenthood.

"Most mothers who come to me are in very involved family situations," Mrs. Hurland said. "Fear of economic security due to too many children leads to unhappy marriage and ultimate divorce. In 1946 there will one divorce every 1.1 marriages. Most experts in the marriage field agree that 60 per cent of the divorces are due to lack of sex education and preparation for marriage. The unwanted child is most apt to become a delinquent. By expanding the Planned Parenthood program in the field of family planning a great contribution can be made in the prevention of divorce and juvenile delinquency."

Mrs. Ketchum outlined the plan for the drive in Oakland County and announced that the goal is \$8,000, half of which will go to the support of the two clinics now operating in the county, as well as to the third clinic which will be opened early in February at Oakdale Gardens, the negro housing project on the Eight Mile and Wyoming roads.

The other half of the money raised will go to the Federation and State League for research and expansion of their programs.
