FOR GENERAL PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD MONDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 1947

To the Qualified Electors of the City of Birmingham County of Oakland, State of Michigan

To vote at this election all persons must be registered in the City by Tuesday, January 28th, 1947, at 8 P. M. Eastern Standard Time.

Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the City of Birmingham twenty days at the time of voting are eligible.

TO REGISTER, call at the City Clerk's office in the Municipal Building on or before Tuesday, January 28th, 1947, during business hours. The City Clerk's office will be open on Tuesday, January 28th, from 8 A. M. until 8 P. M. Eastern Standard Time.
