

### Launch Drive to Get Supplies for European Schools

Mrs. James F. Mitchell of Lusher road, chairman of the committee of organizational contacts for the Birmingham Branch of the Save the Children Federation, announced this week that the SCF has just launched a drive in this area for the purpose of obtaining school supplies, food, and material things for the needy school children in European countries.

The American Association of University Women have already informed her that they will again adopt the French school which they helped support last year.

"To enable the SCF to equip each of the European schools with the textbooks, paper, pencils and

other supplies, it is necessary that \$150 be sent, although lesser amounts can certainly be used," she said. "The AAUW will contribute the \$150 necessary for their French school."

**Benefit Party**  
Also for the SCF, the Junior Department of the Woman's Club will stage a benefit party at the Community House in February, all proceeds to go toward a European school. Further plans for it will be announced at a later date.

In a letter to clubs in Birmingham, Mrs. Mitchell explained the purpose of the Save the Children Federation, and the work they have done in the past.

The United States has been a member since 1922 of the International Federation, with a dedication to help children whenever they are in need. In the United States, among other projects, a great deal has been done for underprivileged children in southern mountain areas, she stated.

The major project of the Federation during the last few years, however, has been sponsoring schools in the liberated countries beginning in France, then Holland, Belgium and other countries.
