Cass Town Hall Reveals Speakers for Fall Season

Detroit Town Hall, for the 19th consecutive season at the Cass Theatre, will present Robert A. Smith, specialist on the Far East, on Oct. 17 for the opening of the 15 Friday Morning Series. Smith is the editor of the foreign desk for the New York Times, writing and broadcasting and lecturing about his field; he is well known for his books "Our Future in Asia" and "Your Foreign Policy." The brilliant English novelist, Rebecca West, will speak on Friday, Oct. 24. Miss West has earned world-wide fame as an outstanding critic and essayist and is now contributor to the New Yorker. Other speakers of authority will be Merle Miller, versatile and gifted member of the younger generation, who directed all of "Yanks" 14 editions, is now author and writer for Saturday Review of Literature, Harper's Magazine and Reader's Digest, and a popular speaker on important new works and a director of Americans United; Eugene O'Neill, Jr., distinguished scholar, teacher and author on drama, poetry and philosophy and the eldest son of America's Nobel Prize winning dramatist, Eubank H. Markham, correspondent for the Christian Science Monitor for Eastern Europe and the Far East, former deputy director of OWI on the Balkans; Dr. George Lawton, psychologist and author of "Aging Successfully" and John Mason Brown, America's leading dramatist, critic, associate editor of the Saturday Review of Literature, with his annual review of current plays and books. Member of Parliament Vivien Kellems, one of the most talked about women in America, will discuss "New Opportunities for Women"; Edwin Stachel, leader in music education, gives his original presentation, "Music is Fun"; Edward D. Dunn, architect, traveler and playwright, has for his subject "America Can Be Proud"; James L. Wick, one of our leading financial writers, is editor and economic analyst of Prentice-Hall's "Washington Letter"; Anasta (Ah-naw-ta), author of "Lands of the Good and Beautiful," Beverly Baxter, M. P., Canadian-born member of the British Parliament and one of the leading editors of England has the subject "An Englishman Looks at World Affairs" and Dr. Robert S. Hartman, septuagenarian speaker with the background of European life since 1913—friend and associate of the inventor of the robot bomb—speaking from Gostapo, discusses "The Crisis of Our Time."

Renew Contract of Flight School

The Bers Flying School, located at the Bers Airport, Birmingham, is one of the 223 G. I. Flight schools in Michigan which have been certified by the Michigan Department of Aeronautics to renew their contract for the 1947-1948 season with the Veterans Administration to enable them to give veterans flight training under the G. I. Bill of Rights, announced Colonel Floyd E. Evans, director of the Department. Evans stated further that certification of all G. I. flight schools in Michigan giving instructions to veterans was necessary to re-qualify under the new provisions of the Michigan Official G. I. Flight Training Curriculum. State Leads in Training Michigan is one of the few states which license flight schools. Many states require approval from the C.A.A. More than 15,000 Michigan veterans are enrolled in the schools under the G. I. Bill of Rights making Michigan the leading state in flight training. According to reports from the Veterans administration, 95 per cent of all flight training in the nation is being conducted in Michigan. The department also certified 42 ground schools, 36 of them conducted by public schools.
