### Expensive

In the subsequent voting, Commissioners Bill Martin, Theron Van Dusen, Donald Bell and Mayor Ralph Kelly agreed to Martin's resolution denying the petition for vacation of the district.

Commissioners Milton Mallerder, Ray Palmer and Bill Moody voted to sustain the petition.

In explaining their vote, they said, "We believe the situation can be settled satisfactorily to all, and be less expensive in the long run to all parties concerned, to eliminate that part of the assessment requiring the blacktopping, and to substitute a heavy oil treatment."

A permanent surfacing could be added when sewer and water connections are installed in the development of the northern half of the street, they pointed out.

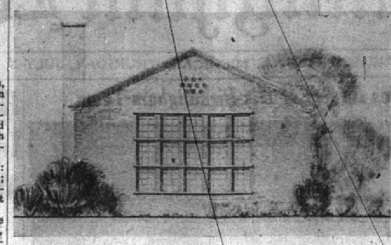

alarmed at the unrest between management and labor in America. They have been and are yet today, looking toward America for leadership in all fields, Buntzen emphasized. "But as you talk to the people there, no matter what their walk of life, you find an aspect of alarm whenever the relationship between labor and management in America is brought up."

"When we here in America realize that these three little nations, hardly 10,000,000 people in all, can withstand the mighty pressure of Communism, we might take a lesson and warning that if we can get our labor-management relationship straightened out and streamlined out fast, we have nothing to fear from Communism."

### Russia Will Back Down

Many of America's great commentators and radio announcers led the nation to believe that war and mass comm. soon, he said, adding, "But I say this to you gentlemen: that war with Russia is far off. However, if the United States should be forced to do so, then we would see and be amazed at how fast Russia would back down."

Russia has no hope or ambition to beat United States in the field of battle, but they are preparing and with some success, to take away American markets so that in this way they can reduce us to a second-rate nation," he explained.

"After all, what is a Communist today? A Communist is only a discouraged individual among us who would like to be where he could have been had he worked hard enough, but being too lazy to do so, he uses non-Christian methods of getting there. And so it is with Russia, who is jealous of the American people and their actions as a whole."

### Forget One Thing

Russia hopes in some way to bring in enough German brains into its country, paying them good salaries, to show them how to outsmart America in mass production, Buntzen declared. "But remember, gentlemen, that successful and happy progress in production or any other field can only be attained in a true democracy."

Therefore, he said in conclusion, if Americans can hurry the day for better relationship between management and labor and be able to distinguish a Communist and properly identify him before he could have been had he worked hard enough, but being too lazy to do so, he uses non-Christian methods of getting there. 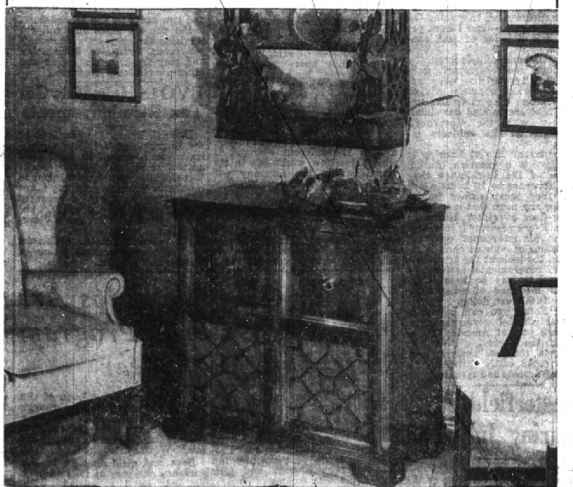
