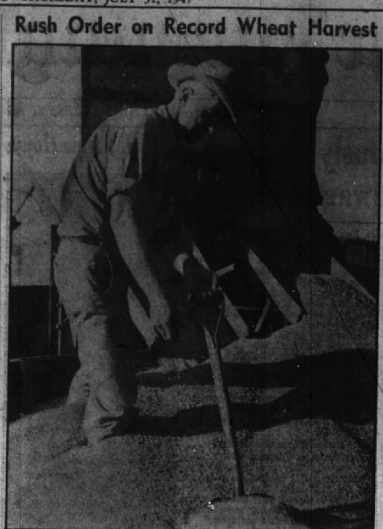

he included in the assessment area.

Commissioner W. E. Moody, after an hour and a half of debate, suggested that the whole proposal be referred back to Egbert for further consideration and recommendation.

But Egbert immediately protested that neither he nor the city engineer department could come up with any better arrangement, that this was the simplest and best method of handling the problem.

Moody then moved to abandon the district with the idea that the city manager could then come back with a recommendation to include the whole area between Maple and Pine streets. His motion failed for lack of a second.

Finally Commissioner Bill Martin moved the necessity of the improvement and the commission sent it along to the city assessor to determine individual assessments for the originally proposed district south of Pine.

They set August 15 as the date of the hearing on the assessment roll.
