Standards for City Streets have discussed the advisability of establishing a standard minimum width for streets which are permanently improved in the future. City Manager D. C. Egbert favors g 32-foot minimum. Several other commissioners at one time or another have expressed the view that 32 feet might be adopted as the base width.

But when it comes right down to establishing a "standard," commissioners still haven't made up their minds. The most recent indication of this is their action last week when commissioners okayed a 22-foot width for the Chesterfield paving. They started, originally, by considering the 32-foot width.

Is Birmingham going to have a mini-mum standard width for streets which are to be permanently improved? Of is the width of a proposed improvement to be determined by the project's own peculiar "circumstances"?\(\)\(\)
