HOW TO Care For Your Dog

Selecting a Dog
At the present time there are over one hundred breeds of dogs recognized by the American Kennel Club. These breeds are classified into groups according to usage, be it work, sport or companionship.

Before selecting a puppy of one or another breed, the prospective purchaser should decide for which purpose he desires the dog, the facilities available for the housing and care of either a larger or smaller breed, and the temperament of the animal.

There is no such thing as "the best breed of dog." Each breed has its own characteristics and merits as well as shortcomings. Then, too, the way in particular a dog develops regardless of its breed is dependent in great degree upon the training or lack of training it will receive.

When actually purchasing the dog, remember that if at all possible it pays to obtain a purebred animal. One that is registered or eligible for registration and which when mature and bred with a suitable mate will reproduce true to type. Economically, the only difference between a purebred and a mongrel is the initial purchase price, since upkeep is the same for dogs of similar size and type.

There is little merit in the old saying that a mongrel is a healthier, harder dog than a purebred. A dog's health depends on a great many variable qualities and factors, starting with inheritance and going on through early feeding and care. Since the inheritance factor is definite and known in a purebred, such dogs start off with that much gained.
