

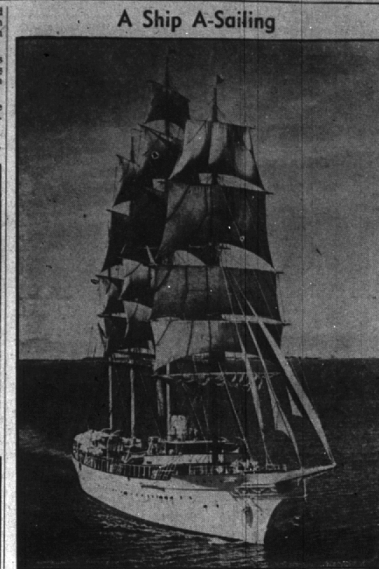
He Asked for It

It's a good thing the Smith's don't play every week because the nights that they do play are well given them the first prize as soon as they walk in the door. How do they do it?

Kidding to one side, Mr. and Mrs. S. make no pretension of being expert bridge players. How they would fare in a master point tournament is an open question. Your reporter has a hunch that they would do very well, perhaps to their own modest astonishment. Why don't you bring a partner to the Community House on Wednesday nights at eight o'clock and form your own opinion?

Your reporter asked Mr. and Mrs. Smith to outline one of the problem hands they have played lately. They couldn't remember any. So, by your leave, we will resort to one of the old chestnuts of double dummy play: the dummy heart contract. South, declarer. Opening lead: king of clubs. Answer next week. Here's the set-up:

NORTH
 S-A Q 2
 H-A K J
 D-Q J 10 9 8 7

WEST EAST
 S-K J 10 9 8 7 Negligible
 H-5 4 3 2
 C-K Q J

SOUTH
 H-10 9 8 7 6
 D-A K
 C-A 10 9 8 7 6

Now for the solution to last week's six spade problem: To the second trick, spade king was played in dummy. Dummy led small spade to the jack in West hand, South playing the ten. Ace of hearts was played which held the trick. Then dummy was entered with a club finesse and the jack of hearts was led. Heart queen fell from South. West ruffed. Small diamond to the ace in dummy. Smallest heart lead. Heart king fell from South. West ruffed. This established the ten of hearts in dummy. West on lead. A club was led to dummy's ace, king falling from North. South ruffed. Now, South, holding queen and eight of spades under West's ace and nine had to lead a diamond to dummy king. South was trapped. Established heart and established club could be thrown at him until he ruffed and was overruffed.
