Thinclads Can't Match Efforts of Canadian Schools

Maple tracksters competed in their first international meet when the mile relay quartet of Chuck Murray, Jack McBride, Duane Murphy and track captain Jack Phister journeyed to London for the University of Western Ontario Relays last Saturday.

Running against Canadian schools which include in their enrollment competing college freshmen, the four 440 racers were pushed to their best time of 3:40.8 to place third.

The winning team, Westdale Collegiate of Hamilton, Ontario, was timed at 3:32.9, which shattered the field record by 6.4 seconds and threatened the Canadian group's mark of 3:31.0.

Second was Niagara Falls Collegiate, Ontario, which also ran in a record breaking time despite the rain which fell consistently during the meet.

Chuck Murray and Duane Murphy both ran in 35.8, their season's best time, but were outdistanced by the speedy Canadian runners.

This trip closes a very successful season for the Birmingham squad which has won every dual meet and the regional and Eastern Michigan League trophies while rating sixth at the state meet.
