# RUBBISH COLLECTION

Notice is hereby given that effective July 1st, 1947, weekly rubbish collections will be made by the City of Birmingham, in accordance with the following schedule.

FEES

FEES).

Washly pick-up of rubbish will be provided for single and two-family residences without cost. Apartments and all, business establishments requiring collection of quantities in excess of three cubic feet per sollection, will be charged a fee of 50c per month or each additional three cubic feet or major fraction thereof.

RESIDENTIAL COLLECTION

The following regulations will apply for collection of rubbish from the residential area

Monday: Section south of Maple Avenue and cast of Woodward Avenue and the section west of Woodward Avenue south of Maple Avenue, east of but not including Pierce Street and north of Lincoln Avenue.

Tuesday: Section north of Maple Avenue and east of Woodward Avenue.

of Woodward Avenue.

Wednesday: Section north of Maple Avenue and
west of Woodward Avenue.

Thursday: Section south of Maple Avenue and
north of Lincoln Avenue, between and including
Pierce Street and Southfield Road.

Pierce Street and Southfield Raad.

Friday: Section south of Lincoln Avenue, west of Woodward Avenue and the section south of Maple Avenue west of Southfield Road.

Note: Delays due to holidays or storms will modify the above schedule and collections will be made immediately after said holiday or storm.

Containers. Refuse should be placed in metal containers of one bushell capacity or a tub of a size commonly designated as No. 1. Yard wastes may be placed in other types of containers for pickup. Branches should be cut in 4 ft. lengths and other tubbish shall be reduced in volume so as to permit safe and speedy handling.

NOTE: Yard wastes such as leaves, grass cutting-etc., shall not be placed in the public, aftects, except in proper containers for pick-up.

Containers: Containers for rubbish shall be located on private property immediately adjacent to the curb or alley line or such locations on the premises that are readily accessible to the trucks at all times. Containers shall be of substantial construction and of sufficient capacity, to accommodate the accumulation of yubbish between periods of collection. Each container shall be identified as to ownership. Containers shall be such as to permit efficient handling of the rubbish and containers which are not acceptable shall be removed upon notice by the Director of Public Works.

Processing of Rubbish. Rubbish shall be processed on as to reduce the bulk and no garbage or other waste of this type shall be mixed with rubbish.

Schedules. Collection will ter made on the following day when delays are caused by holidays or storms.
