Michigan 'terror' INTERESTING—THE NEWS

Stimulated by a \$250,000 state advertising fund, Michigan's state industry is set for a banner season in 1947.

Robert McLoughlin, secretary of the Michigan Tourist Council, reports that 43,000 inquiries have been received from prospective out-of-state travelers.

"Michigan has more accommodations to offer travelers this summer than last year," said McLoughlin. "Easily 100 new cabins have been constructed throughout the state despite the shortage of materials and labor."

"Airlines and bus companies are doing big business. The New York Central has a brand new tourist train called the 'Timber Line' which operates between Detroit and Mackinac City.

"Winter sports have been growing in popularity each year, and next winter should see a further extension of this trend. Fall color tours are a natural for Michigan. We should capitalize more on our beautiful falls."

"Michigan is due to receive nationwide publicity through low technical films to be made this summer by James FitzPatrick, maker of professional motion picture films. One of the FitzPatrick films will portray Michigan's scenic attractions as 'Queen of the Inland Seas.' Our lakes and coastlines are unique; we excel in our abundance of water. The second film will probably feature some of the outstanding scenic and historical spots of the state."

"The April 25 issue of the U. S. News Forecast states that the nation's tourist business in 1947 would reach the ten billion mark. If this is true, then Michigan's share, based on a six to eight per cent, will reach an all-time high."

"Remember that people can buy all the tires and gasoline they want. Many travelers have brand new cars, and they naturally want to use them. All in all, the prospects are very bright. If we get any break in the weather, Michigan should have a banner season."
