Eight Birmingham boys were among the nine hundred Michigan youths who participated in the fourth annual Wolverine Boys' State on the campus of Michigan State College, June 12-20. This statewide affair was under the direction of the American Legion, although many other civic organizations sponsored boys to this mock political gathering.

held. The voting was carried on completely by ballots. The cities and counties were named for past Presidents of the United States. After the elections were over much emphasis was put on law courses which were taught by some of the best criminal and corporation lawyers in this part of the state. Nearly every boy in attendance was brought before a court sometime during his stay for almost any conceivable reason and in order for him or his lawyer to act in court, they must have received a diploma from the Boy's State Law School.
