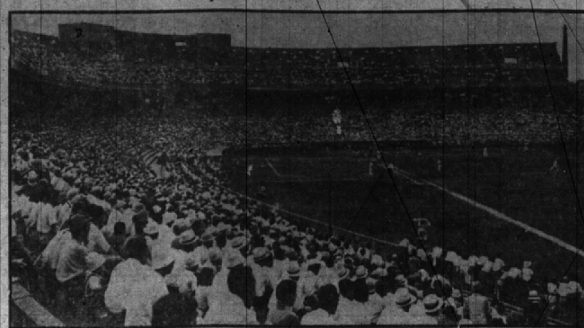

Critic Praises Efforts of Soloists, Choir at Baldwin Concert Last Week

Victor F. Ulrich led the Birmingham High School choir in a very enjoyable and entertaining performance Tuesday evening, May 27, in the Baldwin Auditorium.

The drizzle and rain failed to keep away an appreciative audience, provoked by the hearty applause after each number.

Hardin Van Deusen, baritone, assistant professor of voice and member of the music faculty at the University of Michigan, as well as Dean of the College of Music at Bayview Summer College, Bayview, Mich., was guest artist for the evening.

Van Deusen has delighted Birmingham audiences before and this appearance was no exception. He sang with ease and flexibility which gives the audience the impression that the soloist is sure of himself. These characteristics bring fine tone qualities and good expression.

Van Deusen's selection was "The Way of a Ship," a group of five choral songs by Easthope Martin. His encore was the familiar and always appreciated "None But the Lonely Heart" by Tschalkowsky.

Baldwin Alumni
Mary Jane Stephens, who accompanied Van Deusen, needs no introduction to High School audiences. An alumna of Baldwin High School, her fine interpretation of Van Deusen's songs and her flawless playing, leads one to predict that she should make great progress in the music world.

The program ran the gamut of musical taste. Bach, Negro spirituals, foreign folk tunes and modern compositions were included. Lee Hanson had the solo part in "The Erie Canal." His youthful voice was light but very good.

In Salangdora, a Creole lament, Marge Baker took the solo. She

did exceptionally well. Her high tones were thin, but in the middle register the voice possessed a mellow richness.

Hardy Patterson, who took the solo in "The Birch Tree," a Russian folk tune, sang with ease. Her tones were clear and the choir gave her fine support.

Three members of the band, Jerry Neff, Hugh Quinn and Gerry Hughes, assisted in the rhythmic spiritual, "Dry Bones." They stole the show with their antics.

It was a fine program performed exceptionally well.

Papal Blessing Will Be Read at June Field Mass

The favor of the Papal Blessing from His Holiness Pope Pius XII will be imparted at an unusual field mass in the Municipal Park, Sunday, June 15, at noon in celebration of the 25th anniversary of the founding of Holy Name Catholic Church.

A cablegram was received at Holy Name rectory this week conferring the blessing which was asked for by Charles J. O'Connor of Avon Lane in a private audience with His Holiness when O'Connor stopped in Rome while on a business trip around the world.

"The field made will be in celebration of gratitude for the blessings of 25 years in our fine community," said the Rev. David J. Duncan, pastor of Holy Name, "and every person should feel free to attend."

The mass will be a high point in a three-day celebration of Holy Name's anniversary, and other events will include a children's carnival on Holy Name School campus, Friday, June 13 at 2 p. m., and a Jubilee Village Fair at the Community House Friday evening, June 13, and Saturday afternoon and evening, June 14. Climaxing the whole Jubilee program will be a homecoming reception at the Community House Sunday, June 15, from 2:30 to 4:30 p. m., for parish members, their friends in and out of Birmingham, and former parishioners.
