 More than 1,200 children, under the direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Ruffer and Miss Phyllis Gardner, music teachers, will present a variety of different folk dances from the many different countries of the world.
 Each different school grade will execute the native dance of one particular country in costumes as nearly as possible like those which would be worn for such a dance by the inhabitants of the country.
 Dances of the Swiss, Hungarians, Chinese, Finns, Danes, Germans; and other specialized dances, such as the Mexican-La Rasepe and Italian Tarantella, will be presented.
 The grand finale of the program will be the Paw Paw Polka, a mountain dance from the hills of the United States.
Weeks of Preparation
 The combined choruses of all the different schools—Pierce, Franklin, Barham, Adams and Quant—will be featured in special numbers during the program.
 This Folk Dance Festival has been in preparation for many weeks. Not only the music teachers, but grade school teachers as well have had their efforts to make it a well-rounded and a fitting finale for the year's work.
 For the convenience of attending parents and friends of the performing children, bleachers will be set up at the field from which all may watch the panoramic dance festival.
