FOR CITY OF BIRMINGHAM

BIENNIAL SPRING ELECTION
To Be Held Monday, April 7th, 1947

To the Qualified Electors of the City of Birmingham, County of Oakland, State of Michigan.

To vote at this election all persons must be registered in the City by Tuesday, March 18th, 1947 at 8 o'clock P.M. Eastern Standard Time.

Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the City of Birmingham twenty days at the time of voting are eligible.

TO REGISTER, call at the City Clerk's office in the Municipal Building on or before Tuesday, March 18th, 1947, during business hours. The City Clerk's office will be open on Tuesday, March 18th, from 8 A.M. until 8 P.M. Eastern Standard Time.

Any registered elector who has moved from one address in Birmingham to another address in Birmingham, since he last voted, may cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer at any time before Tuesday, March 18th.
