No Drivers License

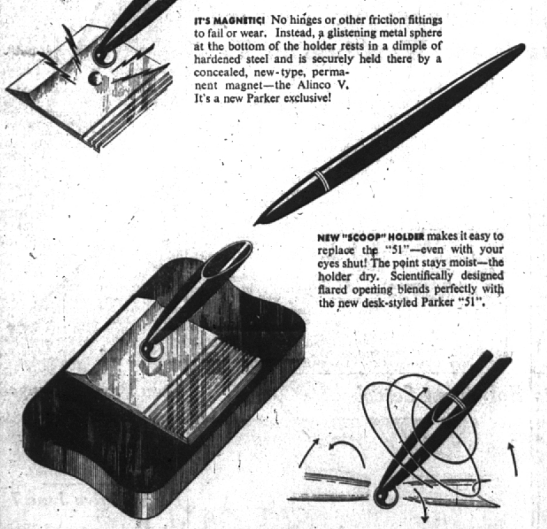

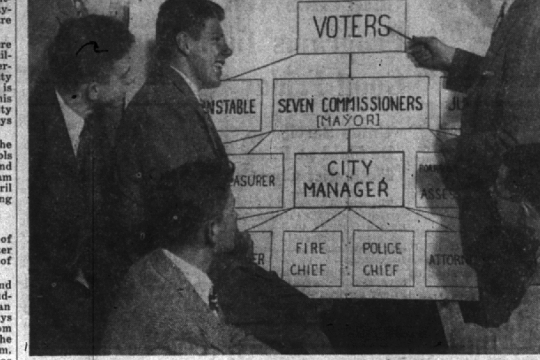
