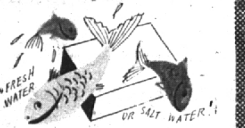

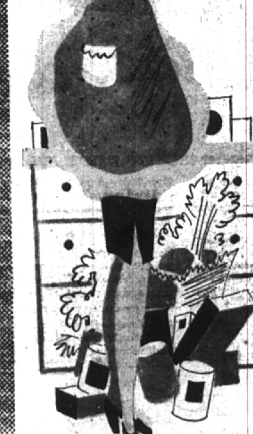

## New Medical Discoveries Useless Unless There Are Hospitals, Say Doctors

New life-saving discoveries by medical scientists are useless without hospitals in which they can be utilized in practice.

This statement is contained in a report by a committee of the medical staff of the projected Woodward General Hospital for which a \$2,500,000 building and campaign is being conducted in 16 South Oakland County communities.

Dr. P. L. Ledwidge of the medical department cited the drop in mortality rates of a number of fatal diseases.

"These reductions in mortality rates are due to development of new medications and new techniques in methods of administration," he said. "Most of these new techniques require hospital facilities for their safe application."

Once Considered Hopeless

Dr. Ledwidge pointed to subacute bacterial endocarditis, a heart ailment which, until three years ago, was considered a hopeless disease with death occurring in almost every case within two years following the onset of the ailment. He stated that approximately 70 per cent of its victims now recover when treated by massive dosages of penicillin given by the continuous intravenous method, he said.

He described epidemic cerebro meningitis as "a scourge of former years because of its high mortality rate and disabling after-effects, which is now curable in virtually 100 per cent of cases by sulfa alone if given early and sufficiently."

"Each of these life-saving treatments can be carried out with safety only in a hospital," he added. "Truly, the modern hospital is a life-saving institution in the care of serious medical cases. It is a necessity for every community."

Practically Eliminate Hasard

Dr. P. Olinacher of the surgical department declared that the "advent of sulfonamides and antibiotics, such as penicillin, has made possible the cure of many formerly hopeless surgical conditions" and that "improvements in operating room technique and anesthesia have practically eliminated the extraneous hazards of surgical operations."

As an illustration of the formerly hopeless cases, Dr. Olinacher said, such as that of the pancreas, esophagus, or lung, which until

## Oakland County RED CROSS NEWS

This week hundreds of volunteers in Oakland County will be soliciting funds for the 1947 Red Cross Fund. All communities have selected their chairman and workers have been assigned their territories. One chairman whose name has not been announced and who has recently accepted the chairmanship is Erwood Dickens, who will direct the campaign in Oakland Gardens.

Though World War II is over, the Red Cross war against misery and suffering is never over but continues in peace time. The local chapter, while concentrating on Home Services, that Red Cross department which deals with active servicemen and veterans, has begun rebuilding its peacetime services, such as first aid, home nursing and water safety. The civilian established thus providing first aid plans for local hospitals. Nurses have been recruited for polo epidemic and an educational nutrition program is being provided.

The disaster committee has been reorganized and members of this committee notified of their responsibility in event of an emergency. Junior Red Cross, that division of membership which includes school children, has filled quotas of gift boxes for children in devastated countries. Many comfort articles have also been completed for patients in veterans hospitals. Services of members of the volunteer service corps are requested by community agencies as well as the chapter.

Motor corps members make special trips for agencies of the community such as driving disabled patients to hospitals. Gray ladies are still active in two hospitals of the county and a group of chapter members make weekly trips to the Dearborn Veterans Hospital where they assist with the care of patients. Prosthesis corps members not only garments for overseas shipment but completes them for local use.

For this vital humanitarian work the Red Cross needs the help of all citizens of Oakland County whose contributions will help thousands of fellow Americans many of them overseas and scores of them in this community.
