Noted Dietitian to Speak Before AAUW Members

When the American Association of University Women meet on March 12 at the Community House for a 1:00 p.m. luncheon, Miss Mary L. Barber will be the featured speaker of the afternoon. Her topic will be "Nothing to Eat but Food."

Miss Barber, a member of AAUW, is one of the most prominent women in the home economics profession in the United States, having served for five years during the war as expert food consultant to the Secretary of War.

She was assigned to the Quartermaster General's department at Washington, D. C. in November, 1945 she was given the meritorious award for exceptional service in recognition of her contribution, which is the highest award a civilian may obtain.

Her undergraduate work was completed at Drexel University; she has a bachelor of science degree from Columbia University, and a doctor of science degree from Drexel.

She is president of the American Dietetics Association, has held high offices in the American Home Economics Association, and is a member of the Business and Professional Women Clubs. She has now resumed her civilian duties as the head of the home economics department of the Kellogg Company, Battle Creek, Mich.

Local VFW Supports 40-Year Home Loans for Ex-Servicemen

Forty-year, low-interest loans to veterans by the FHA are being sought by the Veterans of Foreign Wars, according to Tom Klingsmith commander of local post.

"The new government housing program is of a general nature and the much-advertised veteran's emergency program is no more," he asserted. "Veterans must now depend on a trickle-down process for housing because they cannot afford the high priced homes now being built."

A VFW national housing survey has shown that 90 per cent of World War II veterans cannot pay more than \$20 a month for shelter.

Klingsmith expressed approval of the new regulation of the veterans Administration realizing that all property purchased with GI loans must be evaluated by appraisers chosen by VA instead of the lender.
