Richard Dewey Again Receives Guy Cox Award

For the third consecutive year the 17th district of the American Legion, under the chairmanship of Richard H. Dewey, 219 North Woodward avenue, have been awarded the Guy Cox Trophy. Dewey, a member of the local Chapter Edward Post No. 14, has been chairman of Boy's State activities for the local post for the past several years as well as chairman for the 17th congressional district of Michigan, and has led the district to winning the trophy by maintaining high records on the following points: filling quotas, State sponsoring boys to Boys Posts, sponsoring the largest number of boys compared to the percentage of district membership, having the greatest number of "outside" organizations sponsoring boys, and for having the greatest percentage of auxiliary unit sponsoring boys. Twenty-four of the thirty-one posts in the 17th district are sponsoring 52 boys this year, while eight "outside" organizations sponsor 26 or more for a total of 78 against the district quota of 65. The local boys who will attend the Boy's State Convention this year at Michigan State College are James McCall, Donald R. Wilson, Thomas Mills, Donald E. Kunkel, William Roberts, James Millibrand, William Levelle and William Plant. Local organizations sponsoring boys are the Rotary Club, the Exchange Club, the Hi Twelve Club, the Lions Club, the Junior Chamber of Commerce and the American Legion.
