The Maple tracksters captured another title in coasting to an easy victory in the State track and field regionals held at Ann Arbor last Saturday. They piled up nearly twice as many points as the nearest competitors. In taking the title they brought home another beautiful trophy for the ball case.

In every leg of the 380 and medley relays, Birmingham led the way. The medley relay, unbeaten so far this year, consisted of Bud Worde (for Jack McBride), 440 yard; Jim Carson and Bill Shalberg, 220's; Pete Abbrecht, the 380 or anchor leg. The half-mile team relay of Dick Murray, Harold Murray, Bob Folin and Jack Phister, anchor.

Birmingham swept the golf series with Berkeley, taking both meets; the first by 115-47 1/2 and the last by 1-3. John Anderson was low man in both meets with an 84 and an 87.

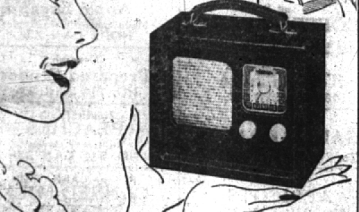
